Thank you for your letter of 12 March 2024 to the Attorney General, the Hon Michael Daley MP, about the progress of the South West Sydney Communities and Justice Precinct (SWSCJP). The Attorney General has asked me to respond on his behalf.

This precinct remains a significant priority for the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ), not only for its strategic importance to South West Sydney and NSW, but for the opportunity to improve equitable access to justice for our communities.

Building on the Precinct Strategic Business Case and SWSCJP Urban Design Framework led by Campbelltown City Council, DCJ continues to prioritise the planning of a redevelopment of the Campbelltown Courthouse and working with NSW Treasury on investment requirements. A Detailed Business Case has been developed and is subject to NSW Treasury budgetary processes.

In the meantime, DCJ is committed to remaining collaborative and transparent with Campbelltown City Council, with ongoing senior executive representation on the SWSCJP Steering Committee chaired by Council.

Thank you for your letter of 17 June 2024 to the Hon Catherine King MP, Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government, regarding the Australian Government's commitments under the Infrastructure Investment Program at the 2024-25 Budget. Minister King has requested that I respond on her behalf.

The Government remains committed to a 10-year infrastructure pipeline, investing over \$120 billion on a rolling program of sustainable investments to deliver projects that will benefit Australian communities.

In relation to the projects referenced in your correspondence, the Government made the following funding commitments in the 2024-25 Budget:

- \$32.5 million for the South West Sydney Roads – Planning project, which will develop final business cases for critical road upgrades in South West Sydney, including Hume Highway, Cowpasture Road, Camden Valley Way and Menangle Road, to support housing growth in the Greater Macarthur Growth Area and the South West Growth Area. The business cases will identify upgrades needed to address congestion, improve road safety and enhance accessibility.
- An additional \$20 million for the South West Sydney Rail Planning - Business Case project, which brings the Government's total contribution to the project to \$97.5 million. This project will develop a Final Business Case and allow for early property acquisitions, if required, for a rail line from Bradfield to Glenfield via Leppington, and from Bradfield to Macarthur. The Final Business Case will consider heavy and light rail, and provide the detailed design, economic assessment and cost estimation to inform an investment decision for the construction of the extension.

- \$15 million for the Western Sydney Roads – Planning project, which will develop Final Business Cases for upgrades to Great Western Highway/Parker Street; The Northern Road, Borrowdale to Londonderry; and Werrington Arterial Stage 2 – St Marys to Marsden Park. The business cases will support the Western Parkland City and address a series of upgrades in the region to support housing development and flood evacuation.

The Australian Government will work closely with the New South Wales Government to deliver these nationally significant infrastructure projects.

Thank you for taking the time to write to the Australian Government on this matter.

Thank you for your correspondence regarding the establishment of a grant program for cat enclosures. I understand you also wrote to the Hon. Penny Sharpe MLC, Minister for Climate Change, Minister for Energy, Minister for the Environment, and Minister for Heritage. As the *Companion Animals Act 1998* fall within my area of responsibility, I trust you will accept this as a response on behalf of the both of us.

The issue of cat management is one that the NSW Government is taken very seriously. Pet cats are beloved family members to many in the community, but they can be dangerous predators of wildlife, and contribute to the endangerment of many native species.

While the policy issues associated with animal management are challenging, the issues caused by nuisance cats, stray cats, and feral cats are being closely examined. Addressing the complexities of cat management requires careful consideration of the policy implications on owners and communities alike.

In my capacity as Minister for Local Government, I have referred the matter of cat containment to the NSW Parliament's Animal Welfare Committee to thoroughly test these issues. The NSW Government will consider all recommendations and options, including the use of cat enclosures. I understand the Committee will begin to undertake its work later in 2024. In the meantime, Council may wish to consider applying for a grant for this cat enclosure project from sources such as the NSW Environmental Trust.

I strongly encourage all interested community members and stakeholders, including Campbelltown Council, to participate in the Cat Management Inquiry when it announces public submissions, as the Government will closely consider its recommendations and the evidence it receives in formulating a path forward.

The NSW Government is committed to ensuring companion animals are well looked after throughout their lives and determined to deliver the best animal welfare standards in Australia. Last year the NSW Government delivered a \$40.6 million companion animal welfare grants package to improve companion animal welfare outcomes in NSW through

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the delivery of several non-government-focused initiatives. The Cat Protection Society was one such grant recipient, receiving \$1.5 million to deliver cat desexing programs in targeted council areas. In addition, 64 rehoming organisations received funding under the Companion Animal Welfare and Rehoming Competitive Grant, totalling \$4.9 million.

The NSW Government is committed to reforming animal welfare in NSW to provide better outcomes for both endangered native species and companion animals. One of the Government's election commitments is to develop a new Animal Welfare Framework, which includes the establishment of the independent Office of Animal Welfare, demonstrating our dedication to the well-being of animals across the region.

I hope this information has been of assistance to you and I appreciate you taking the time to write in relation to this matter.
